

understanding that will contribute to their future craft cluster projects. This experience has significantly enriched their perspective on traditional crafts and the craftsmanship of Bengal.


Officials from FDDI, Ankleshwar visit VNSGU, Surat



The study evaluates various types of spacer fabrics and their effectiveness in sports shoe uppers, contributing valuable insights into material innovation in sports footwear.
