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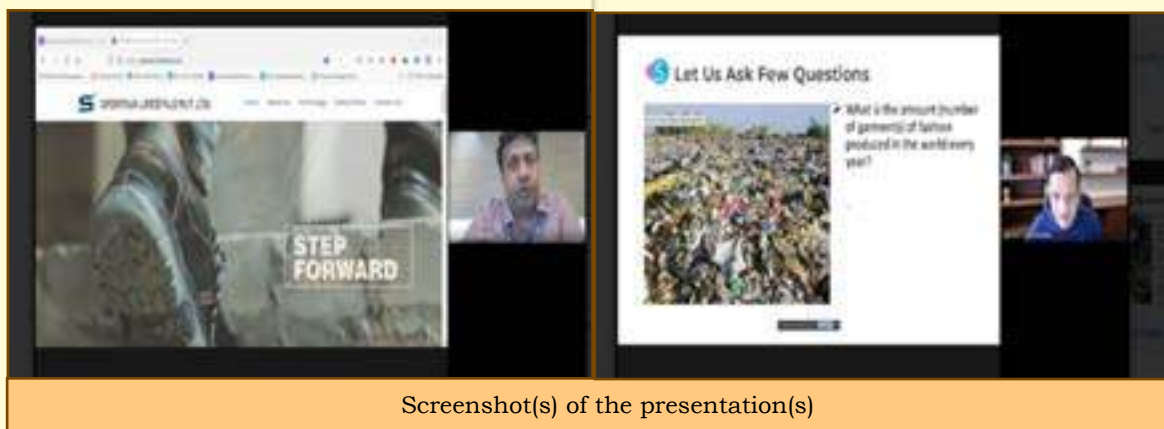
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The experts gave insights on the concepts and practical tips which are the essential ingredients of success in the current industrial scenario.

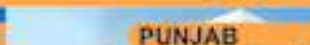

CVC's Guidelines on Procurement Price Negotiations

- Negotiations with the L1 only in certain exceptional situations which would include procurement of proprietary items, items with limited sources of supply, and items where there is a suspicion of a cartel formation.
- Justifications and details of such negotiations should be duly recorded and documented without any loss of time.
- Compelling reasons must be recorded by the authority recommending negotiations.
- Competent authority should exercise due diligence while accepting a tender or ordering negotiations or calling for a re-tender.

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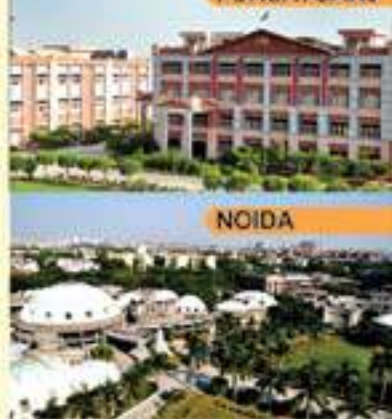


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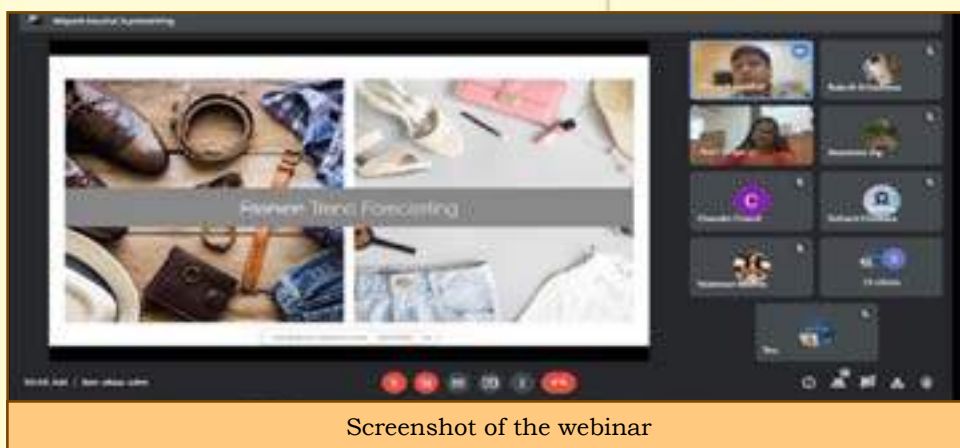
Webinar on 'Fashion Forecasting-An Insight to the Industry' held at FDDI, Chandigarh (Banur) campus
