An online training session on the various aspects of the RTI Act, 2005, was conducted on 24th January 2024 which was attended by approximately 40 employees across FDDI campuses, including CPIOs, Heads of School, Heads of Department, and other key personnel working across different functional of management including administration, purchase, placements, finance, IT etc.

The three-hour session, led by Mr. Jitender Bhatti, a former faculty member of ISTM, was extremely informative and comprehensive.

Mr. Bhatti meticulously covered all 31 sections of the RTI Act, elucidating the roles and responsibilities of CPIOs/APIOs, discussing exemptions granted under the RTI Act, and emphasizing the significance of suo-moto disclosure under

Section 04.

He also explained on the RTI-MIS, which is instrumental in the effective implementation and monitoring of the RTI Act and plays a crucial role in ensuring compliance and transparency in the processes.

Sharing the details, Mr. Anil Kumar, AFHQ-CS, Executive Director (ED), FDDI, Jodhpur said, "In this modern business environment, technology is always changing, keeping this in mind, the meticulously designed training programme was conducted."

The training was imparted by the experts of School of Footwear Design & Production of FDDI, during which information on new technology, design and product development, materials to be used etc. were provided. Along with this, various



issues with respect to design, sole, stitching, finishing and leather work were also explained in depth and their solution through new technology was explained and taught.

During the closing ceremony of the training program, on 19th January 2024, Mr. M.R. Baloch, IFS, PCCF, Director-AFRI was the 'Chief Guest' who in his address stating that "There is a great need for value addition in the traditional leatherand footwear sector, so that trained personnel in the related field can take this industry to next level."

Keynote lecture by Dr. Madhusudan Pal, Director - CoE, FDDI at Shri Jagannath Medical College, Puri

During the 35th Annual Conference of Association Physiologist of Odisha (ACAPO), Dr. Madhusudan Pal, Scientist -G & Director, CoE, FDDI delivered keynote lecture on the topic 'Physiological and Ergonomics Approaches Product Design & Development: Special Reference to Footwear' at Shri Jagannath Medical College, Puri.

Addressing the audience, Mr. Pal briefed about the ergonomic approach to footwear that involves understanding the diverse needs of individuals a tailoring solutions to meet these needs of individual's unique physiological and biomechanical characteristics irrespective of varying indole or gradient.

"As Planter Pressure increased with increment of gradient (10%) in all region including forefoot, midfoot, heel medial, lateral of both feet compare to level walking and maximum felt at heel (18.22%). Whereas,

less impact felt at heel region by using Low-density polyurethane (LDPU) material compare to High-density polyurethane (HDPU) and Silicone rubber insole in military footwear. However, evaluation of threshold value of vertical ground reaction force (792N) is important predictor for fracture determination of specific footwear. So, proper deign can absorb this maximum force, leads to improve balance and stability," he said.
