

Mr. Rambabu Muppidi, Design Faculty of FDDI, Hyderabad campus submitted his innovative design title 'Leather – Wood Bird Toy' to Indian Patent Office, Intellectual Property Building, and Kolkata, India.

The design of the Leather-Wood Bird Toy is based on his handicrafts studies on wooden handicrafts where is was found that the white wood toy craft is very famous for wooden accessories in Godavari coastal zone of Andhra Pradesh. Innovating with leather, wood, cloth, and pull papers, he thought differently and did his design in Sketch, CAD, and manual. Innovatively, making use of various materials, he thought of toys, papers, pulp, POP, Darmacol, wood, plaster of Paris, dry grass, coconut, acrylic, cloth, jute, etc.



This innovative design of Mr. Rambabu, Faculty of FDDI School of Leather Goods & Accessories Design (LGAD), has been applied for design protection of the title bearing Design Number: 401826-001, Class: 21-01 with registration date 11.12.2023.
